I also would like to welcome our new member Lee Simmonds KC9CDT from Jefferson Twp. He is already jumping in there by helping out with the Flower Power Flower Bulb Sales! Welcome Lee and thank you.

I would like to thank Don KA9QWC for lighting the fuse under us in getting VHF Packet active again here in the County. We are using 144.950 Mhz as our Whitley County LAN VHF Packet frequency once again. Don/KA9QWC& Cathy WB8ORR, Roger/N9QCL, Dave/N9VTF & Jeanne/N9XXM, Dan/N9WNH & Melanie/W9NNH and of course the EMA/RACES Station/ KC9ANF are all on the air. If you have a computer with software/or a TNC and a VHF radio get onboard.. If you need help getting things going again give one of us a call.

I am repeating some things from last month to give you another chance to communicate your feelings or become involved in all the activities we do and the upcoming projects.

Activities:

If you have an idea for a program please let Becky or any of the committee members know your thoughts. Upcoming programs are PSK31 and CoCoRaHS. Becky N9RJB is asking all of the committee members to have some sites picked out and initial information gathered before the April General Meeting as you will be meeting at 6:30 PM. Anyone else is also encouraged to input suggestions or information.

Some additional help or backups are needed for the Columbia City Early Warning Tests. This is a joint effort that involves ARES/RACES/SKYWARN and the WCARC.. The tests are the first and third Mondays of every month at 12 PM weather and forecast permitting. If we have enough people to help even if it is just once in awhile it give some fellow hams a break or you might fill in when they are unable to make it. It only takes a few minutes of your time and gives us another public service that we can say we provide. For more information contact Henry N9HM EWS Test Coordinator.

Communications:

I would like to hear some feedback on the issue of the newsletter, website etc. We decided quite some time ago to save some money by emailing the newsletter out to the club members and by putting the newsletter on the website. The cost of printing up the newsletter is rising just to have five or so copies for a meeting now costs in the neighborhood of \$8-\$11 per month depending on how long it is. Now that means that we spend around twelve members dues per year just so we can have a few newsletters available at a meeting.

For the most part the newsletter consists of a front page with birthday announcements, the second and third page consist of Board, Appointed Positions and Committee members. This is followed by the Club Roster, President and V. President articles, usually an article from Don KA9QWC or one or two other club members every once in awhile and a calendar page.

How many of you read the newsletter and or contribute something to it? I guess I am questioning the need for a separate newsletter when all of this can be put on the website as a running newspaper type of page with side click bars for specific subjects or areas of interest. .

I know myself and others appreciate what Roger N9QCL has done with the website and the newsletter over time along with the past works of Don KA9QWC, Charlie WB9FZO and Randy N9STQ. But I feel that our website is underutilized and has not essentially changed it's look and purpose from it's inception and I know others have mentioned they would like to see more and updated information posted there. I feel that we should make the full transition and move ahead. This page could contain information such as the club By-Laws and Constitution, Net Rosters, Net Control Schedules, Net Preambles, more in depth ARES/RACES/SKYWARN local information, more focus on our activities, club history, more pictures and updated links. I think we need to address not only the costs that were to be essentially removed by not printing a newsletter and removing the problem all together and putting it all on the website and in turn making the website more interesting and useful.. Let the committee know your thoughts.

Education & Training:

This topic has not been addressed and does need some research as far as the need of Technician or higher classes. But we have some immediate needs that are pressing also such as traffic handling, net operations, packet operations etc that could be taught in a class atmosphere any interest.

Finance and Fund-Raising:

We have brought up the need for fund-raising and finance reform. We have procured one fund-raising item which is flower bulb sales. The company specializes in fund-raising for clubs etc. The WCARC Board has decided to give a try as it costs the club nothing. But the rewards could be endless depending on our commitment. We keep 50% off the top of what we sell right of the bat. There is no delivery or shipping charges. But once the orders are placed all of them will be shipped to a central address and then is up to those that have gathered orders to deliver them to the recipients. I am asking the membership to not just look at the minimum to sell but make a goal of filling at least one sales sheet. One sheet contains 17 possible order slots. Most items are in the \$10-\$15 range. Everybody should know enough people to fill one sheet per member. The deadline for the orders including all monies to be turned into to me is no later than April 13th.

We are also discussing how the 50/50 drawings are handled and where the money should go. We are also addressing the Health & Welfare Fund. and how it should be handled. If you have ideas, concerns, comments let Richard W9EEE, Henry N9HM or myself know as we are wanting feedback.

I would like to see us start on the issue of 501C(3) status inquiries again. I am asking the Finance & Fundraising Committee to get ready to put their heads together and start checking on the costs of this.

We are still hoping to apply for a local grant for system hardware and installation costs. With some needed paperwork we hopefully can try this again.

Health & Welfare:

I've asked the Health & Welfare Committee to come up with guidelines and protocols for that committee in writing. We have never had any type of written guide for the committee to go by and it can be a problem with new committee members not knowing what should be done. This gathering of information will include the duties of the committee, protocols for handling estates, ill, elderly or other types of assistance needed by a county ham or club member, condolence amounts and to whom etc. If you have any thoughts let Henry N9HM, Melanie W9NNH, Don/KA9QWC or Cathy WB8ORR know.

Historical:

We are still awaiting word from Chuck WB9DNE regarding some information for our Whitley County Amateur Radio Silent Key Webpage on the WCARC Website. He mentioned that Paul Woods KB9DOH has become a silent key awhile ago and is gathering the information for us. .

We are in need of those photo's, rosters, newspaper clippings and internet articles you may have, that are gathering dust to share with the outside world. So cough them up and let's get them where people can view them on the club website. Give Don, Henry or myself a call if you have something that we could borrow to copy or scan.

Membership:

Melanie has been mailing out post cards that the club has a supply of to potential new members and invite a number of them every month to the club meetings and activities. We will concentrate on a new area every month. We have mailed to Jefferson Twp. area and gained one new member. This month we will be mailing to the Churubusco area. If you know of some fellow ham that is not a member or if someone that might be interested in the hobby feel free to invite them. In fact we encourage you to do so. If you have any question you can contact Don KA9QWC, Melanie W9NNH or I.

Station & Repeater:

The Board approved the purchase of a DTMF hand microphone that is needed for the new Alinco DR-135T VHF radio that now belongs to the club. We are still awaiting arrival of this. I called Phil AB9IZ and he checked on the order status and said it hasn't been shipped as of yet.

We are working with EMA/DHS in procuring equipment and installation costs for the VHF Repeater through a DHS Interoperability Communications Grant in 2009. We are also awaiting a written MOU between EMA/DHS and the WCARC for future situations and issues. We have decided to make use of another local grant if awarded to move and improve the UHF Repeater. Site procurement is still on-going at this time. We know we have one local at no cost but for only one system. We have a possibility of another east of Columbia City if some issues can be worked out. We have another potential site to the west that talks need to be renewed yet. This is an on-going process.

None of these will not happen without grants and fund-raising through the work of many people including yourself. Ask yourself what you can do for the club and to support the local communication systems.
