Ham radio operators are storm's 'unsung heroes

23. December 5, Associated Press – (Northwest) Officials: ham radio operators are storm's 'unsung heroes.' When parts of Oregon were overwhelmed by wind and water during the recent storm, vital communication often was lacking, with trees down and across phone lines and cell coverage limited. Even the state police had difficulty in reaching some of their own troops. But ham radio worked. In fact, amateur radio operators were heralded by state emergency officials as heroes. Ham radio is more than just a hobby to some. It can set up networks for government and emergency officials to communicate when other communication services fail. "One of the problems in this is always communication," said Oregon's governor Tuesday. "I'm going to tell you who the heroes were from the very beginning of this...the ham radio operators. These people just came in and actually provided a tremendous communication link to us." A network of at least 60 volunteer amateur radio operators working along the coast and inland helped from keep crucial systems such as 911 calls, American Red Cross and hospital services connected. They relayed information about patient care and relayed lists of supplies needed in areas cut off by water. In addition to getting an FCC license to operate, certain groups of operators are cleared by the federal government to work as emergency responders. The Oregon Office of Emergency Management said the radio operators were tireless in their efforts to keep the systems connected. It was ham radio that kept New York City agencies in touch with each other after their command center was destroyed on 9-11, according to the National Association for Amateur Radio. When hurricanes like Katrina hit, amateur radio helped provide life-and-death communication services when everything else failed. Source:

Dan N9WNH Secretary read the minutes of the last Board meeting and they were approved as read.

The Committee told her that we would contact her sometime after this meeting and setup a time for delivery of the check.

Don KA9QWC mentioned that Bill KB9MDR had recently been involved in another wreck near Fishkill, New York. That the vehicles received minor and major damage and that he was ok but was sore and stiff. He is staying with his sister in Fort Wayne for now.

Henry N9HM advised those present that unfortunately Judy has to return to Minneapolis for further treatment because of further complications.

Ewing K9RWO wondered how we did with the Auction and the Hamfest table and if we were going to provide a report to Charlotte. Dan N9WNH said yes we would be. Dave WB9UNL said we will cover this topic a little later in the meeting.

Station/Repeater Committee:

Dave WB9UNL asked if there had been any further developments lately. Dan N9WNH stated as far as Embarq goes no new information has been received other than he had sent an email to Jack Moore a couple of days ago but has not received a reply.

Dan said that he has not contacted anyone yet concerning assistance with the removal of the Comet GP-9N Antenna, the 150' of 1/2" heliax or the mounts on the tower but he will be by next week. The antenna, jumper and heliax will need to be inspected to see what repairs can be done.

Dan also mentioned that after the last VE test session Roger N9QCL, Junior WB9SPY, Dave WB9UNL, Melanie KC9MJT and he had removed the last of the known club equipment from the "new" Jail. WCARC Fort Wayne Hamfest Table:

Dave WB9UNL then asked for a report of the outcome of the WCARC table at the Fort Wayne Hamfest. Dan N9WNH announced that again we did very well in dispensing with the Glenn Willson N9KXL (SK) equipment and the few items we had left to sell of the club's.

The WCARC dispensed with the Kenwood TS140S, Kenwood MC-50 Desk Microphone and the MFJ989 Versa Tuner. The WCARC purchased the Kenwood TS850SAT, Kenwood MC-60 Desk Microphone and a Diamond X50N VHF/UHF Antenna from the estate.

The WCARC now owns two fairly modern HF radios with built in automatic tuners, which was our goal by selling the ICOM 730, Kenwood TS140S and the MFJ Tuner. The Diamond X50N was purchased as a utility antenna to serve at events or functions and or to serve as a backup antenna for either repeater or as a remote receiver antenna.

We did take over a 300' spool of 75 ohm 7/8" hardline belonging to the club to sell at the hamfest but it did not sell. We will look at other options in dispensing with this unneeded item along with a tower or so and the remaining items of the estate.

The WCARC did gain some needed funds also along with the wanted equipment. Lanny K9OOP was able to sell all but one of all the items he brought to his table and Ewing K9RWO did pretty well also with his sales at the club table. Dan N9WNH said he did not do all that well and only sold one item! We have a pretty sizeable check to give to Charlotte Willson at this time and with further sales of the remaining equipment it will only increase. Dave WB9UNL thanked all those involved and said we should be proud of what we accomplished. The group gave a big round of applause.

December 13th WCARC Dinner Meeting:

Discussion was turned to the upcoming Dinner Meeting. It was questioned as to whether a program or speaker was decided on for the event. Amateur Radio Classes:

Dave WB9UNL mentioned that since it is getting too late in the year to deal with classes at this point, that it would be the 2008 Board's responsibility. He also mentioned the local CERT team might have interest in this.

New Business:

2007 Amateur of the Year Award:

Dave WB9UNL asked if someone could pickup the award to be presented to Dan N9WNH. Roger N9QCL volunteered to take care of this.

February 2008 WCARC Meeting:

Dave WB9UNL noted that since the Peabody Library will be having it's Book Fair that week, the 2008 Board will have to make other arrangements for that night since the rooms won't be available.

December 27th Board Meeting:

Dave WB9UNL reminded everyone that the last Board Meeting is a transition meeting between the out-going and in-coming Board members. He asked that all be sure to attend that meeting if at all possible.

Being no further business the WCARC Board of Directors closed the regular session of the meeting at 8:25 PM.

The WCARC Board of Directors opened an Executive Session of the Board to discuss WCARC By-Laws concerning Club Membership Conduct at 8:25 PM. The meeting was adjourned at 9:27PM.

Unlike a flower that plague will not fade away in memory nor will the passing of her father be soon forgotten either.

WCARC 440 NETS – KA9QWC

The Whitley County Amateur Radio Club (WCARC) Sunday night 440 Net remains active. The stations that checked in during the month of July and the number of times follows. WD9DBM = 1; W9EEE = 1; KB9FBA = 1; WB8ORR = 4; KA9QWC = 4; N9QCL = 2; WB9UNL = 3 and N9WNH = 2. That totals to 18 check-ins, and 43 minutes.

Remember this net does take radio traffic and it would be a good opportunity to practice. By that I mean if you would desire to send traffic to someone local or distant in another state feel free to generate your traffic on this net. Someone will get that message into a traffic net. Basically all you need is to put the message in the proper format and we can help on any problems in that area.

WRONG WAY EXCITEMENT – KA9QWC

Most of us have probably heard about sport scenes where a player runs in the wrong direction and the player runs harder as the fans scream louder such as in football and basketball. Then the big letdown after that excitement to learn one has scored points for the wrong team. But that is sports and no life threatening harm done in that sense.

On the other hand recently we heard on the scanner about a vehicle on US-30 that was traveling the wrong way going eastbound in the westbound lane. It is sad to say that this scenario is not that infrequent for the most part. But if one is to stop and think about it for a minute we are speaking of a very possible life threatening or serious situation in this case!

I am calling this scenario to the attention of our readers because what if it was you coming face to face very suddenly against an oncoming vehicle? Would you be able to react in time to avoid an accident or would this cause you to swerve and create an accident? Think about it for a minute, just hearing it on a radio may not cause you any harm but what if the event occurred while it was YOU facing a wrong way driver! Probably most of the time a lot of us are not totally focused on the traffic with our attention on something else in our vehicle.

Fortunately in this most recent case no one was hurt. But what is more alarming to hear was that it was the apparent 3rd time this same individual was driving in the wrong lane! I will spell it out a bit different THIRD time driving in the wrong lane. Now that I got your attention just remember to stay focused on that highway when it is you driving.

HF RADIO OPERATION THOUGHTS – KA9QWC

The ham radio world listens out there when we talk or check into various radio nets. They can evaluate our signal and antenna performance by what they perceive is your station location and general propagation. For example on the Indiana Traffic Net (ITN) that operates daily on or about 3910 KHZ. If you were not checking into the net from your residence it would be proper to clarify your location. If you happen to check into the net lets say at the EOC it would be proper to state such. There are several other reasons for doing it this way, but antenna evaluation and location could become important.
